NOW COMES DEFENDANTS, Inez Brown and City of Flint, by and through their attorney, Angela Wheeler and for Answer to Plaintiff's Complaint state as follows:

Friday, July 31, 2020 at 5 p.m. is the deadline for the City Clerk's office to receive absentee ballot requests from registered voters in the City of Flint for the State Primary Election to be held on Aug. 4, 2020.

Although City Hall has been closed since March due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and will remain closed for an indefinite future, the Clerk's office will be open daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. starting July 20. In addition, the office will be open on Saturday, Aug. 1, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. to receive absentee ballots over the counter.

Despite the closure of City Hall, the Clerk's office has continued to process absentee ballot requests received in the office.

Individuals who enter City Hall are required to wear a mask, per Gov. Gretchen Whitmer's Executive Order 2020-147.

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

#### AFFIDAVIT OF INEZ M. BROWN

- 1. I am Inez M. Brown.
- 2. I am the City Clerk for the City of Flint.
- 3. I have served as the City Clerk for over 20 years.
- 4. I have workers for several federal officials on the federal and executive level to assist in the promotion of voting and human rights for the last 55 years.
- 5. It is my duty and honor to serve the residents of the City of Flint.
- 6. I oversee elections in the City of Flint, handling from 2 to 3 elections per year, some of which are federal.
- 7. I understand that voting is a right that may be exercised by every citizen.
- 8. My staff and I provide training to election workers prior to each election, going above and beyond the State requirements.
- 9. This regular training is to ensure that the election workers are trained to properly to handle all aspects of each election.
- 10. There is a primary election scheduled for August 4, 2020.
- 11. To ensure that every voter that has requested an absentee ballot receives it timely as required by the state election law, I have secured 9 trained and experienced part-time employees, dedicated solely to the processing of absentee applications to send the ballots out to the voters.

- 12. These 9 part-time employees work directly with 7 full-time City Clerk's Office employees that are also experienced in elections, to process absentee ballot applications.
- 13. The above-mentioned full-time and part-time dedicated staff also work extended hours on the weekend to continue to process absentee ballot applications.
- 14. As of July 17, 2020, 7423 absentee ballots have been sent out to voters. Attached is the Ballots Sent and Returned Summary updated on July 16, 2020 (See Exhibit 1).
- 15. Many of the ballots that were received by the voters are already beginning to be returned to the City Clerk's Office by the voters.
- 16. Absentee ballot applications will continue to be processed on a daily basis by the City Clerk's Office, seven days a week leading up to the election.
- 17. To ensure that all ballots are received and counted, I have communicated with the U.S. Post Office staff and confirmed that absentee ballot request received will be expedited and returned to the City Clerk's Office.
- 18. In an effort to assist the voters with the return of their ballots to the City Clerk's Office on a 24 hour, 7 days per week basis, the City Clerk's office purchased an official absentee ball drop box (See Exhibit 2).
- 19. The absentee ballot drop box is placed in front of Flint City Hall, properly labeled and identified as the absentee ballot drop box.
- 20. The absentee ballot drop box is sealed in concrete with a video camera monitoring to ensure that no voter is disenfranchised and every vote is counted.

- 5. The testing ballot testing process is based on the State Elections Bureau's Promulgated Rules. The rules vary for each election cycle.
- 6. On June 25, 2020 at around 1:30 p.m., the City Clerk's Office receive 122 boxes of absentee ballots (See Exhibit 1).
- 7. Seven of the boxes contain test ballots for each of the 61 precincts located the City of Flint.
- 8. The ballots are required be tested to confirm whether or not the ballots are able to be read.
- 9. This verification process ensures that every vote is counted when it is scanned into the Qualified Voter File.
- 10. In the August 4<sup>th</sup> Primary Election, there are 36 ballots per test deck with the exception of 12 precincts having 26 ballots in the test desk for the 49<sup>th</sup> State District.
- 11. After the ballots are verified, they are mailed out to the voters.
